Dean's Message: Climate Change and Health Center Launched

The signs of climate change are everywhere and cannot be denied or ignored. The effect on public health is already being felt and it is likely to become increasingly severe.

To address this emerging and urgent need, the Yale School of Public Health has launched The Yale Center on Climate Change and Health (YCCCH). This center will utilize research, education, public health practice and service to contribute to a stable and safe climate in which human health and ecosystems thrive.

YCCCH will fundamentally reshape the way that the Yale School of Public Health—and Yale—address climate change. It is a significant step forward for our school and I am excited to see the important contributions our new center will make to our understanding of climate change and how we might mitigate human suffering.

Directed by Professor Robert Dubrow, the center will emphasize interdisciplinary research with our sister schools at Yale. It already has over two dozen affiliated faculty from throughout the university. Similarly, we will engage students from across Yale and, as always, will be looking for collaborations with scientists from other institutions to address this critical challenge together.


